GARDENING TIP:

What herb am I?

My name means dragon and I was once used to ward off that creature's bite.



Yes, Virginia, you do need to fertilize your herb garden. Because our growing season is almost a full year, plants are taxed during that growing season. Seminole Springs Herb Garden in Eustis, FL. recommends a monthly feed with a liquid fertilizer such as Peters 20-20-20 Plant Food. Peters is formulated for foliage plants and unlike Miracle Grow will not stimulate an annual or biennial herb into flowering. Fish emulsion is a good option but offers only 9% nitrogen and needs to be applied more frequently. Apply fertilizers in the morning before temperatures reach 80° and do not apply to a stressed or dry plant.

Pick It Up... It's Your Doodie!

All dog and cat owners in Cobblestone are reminded of the importance of being a responsible pet owner and a good neighbor, and should be aware that city ordinances exist pertaining to the removal of pet excrement, punishable by a fine of \$250. It is the responsibility of every pet owner to pickup excrements left behind by their pet and properly dispose of it.

Dog feces are more than just a nuisance – it can pose a serious health hazard. A number of common parasites are transmitted via dog feces. When infected dog droppings are left on the ground, the eggs of the roundworms and other parasites can linger in the soil for years. As a result, anyone who comes in contact with the soil also comes in contact with the infected eggs. Further, pet waste can be washed away and carried by rainwater into storm drains to contaminate nearby rivers and streams.



When walking your dog, you can easily do the right thing. Keep your dog on a leash as required by city ordinance and use a plastic bag to pickup waste. When finished, just place the waste in your garbage can. Everyone will be happier when you pick up after your pet!

This also applies to cats.
